

# Global Travel Restrictions during COVID-19 Outbreak

## I. Restrictions on Entering Hong Kong

- Since March 25, 2020, all **non-Hong Kong residents arriving by plane from overseas countries and regions** are denied entry to Hong Kong; **non-Hong Kong residents arriving from the Mainland, Macao and Taiwan** denied entry if they have been to any overseas countries and regions in the previous 14 days.
- **Air transit/transfer services at Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA)**: Passengers can use HKIA for transit/transfer on flights operated by different airlines with the same air ticket, provided they have checked through at the port of origin, with boarding passes printed and baggage tagged through to final destination.
- **Transfer/transit services** for passengers from airports in Mainland China resumed on August 15 until further notice. Transfer/transit services to destinations in Mainland China remain unavailable at HKIA. Layover time of transfer/transit passengers at HKIA must be within 24 hours.
- Travellers from designated high-risk places, or who have visited a high-risk place in the past 14 days, must provide a negative COVID-19 test and proof of 14-day hotel booking before boarding their plane. Currently, high-risk places are: **Bangladesh, Belgium, Ethiopia, France, India, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Russia, South Africa, Turkey, the United Kingdom and the United States of America. - Who is not affected by above rule: A person in transit in Hong Kong or a person exempted from compulsory quarantine under gazetted specifications.
- The inaugural flights under the **Hong Kong-Singapore Air Travel Bubble (ATB)** originally scheduled on November 22 have been deferred in view of the recent epidemic situation in Hong Kong. ## II. Compulsory Quarantine of Certain Persons Arriving in Hong Kong

- **Inbound travellers from the Mainland, Macao or Taiwan**, including Hong Kong and non-Hong Kong residents are subject to compulsory quarantine at designated places (home, hotel or other accommodation), other than people exempted under the “Compulsory Quarantine of Certain Persons Arriving at Hong Kong Regulation”. - From November 23, **Hong Kong residents** who, upon fulfilment of certain conditions, including not having been to places other than Hong Kong, Guangdong Province or Macao in the past 14 days, could be exempted from the 14-day compulsory quarantine requirement when they return to Hong Kong under the Return2hk Scheme. A proof of a valid negative COVID-19 (RT-PCR) test conducted within 3 days is required. A quota arrangement will be put in place to control the number of cross-boundary travellers during the initial stage of the implementation of the Return2hk Scheme. - From November 13, inbound travellers who have been to any places outside China in the past 14 days are subject to compulsory quarantine, excluding those exempted under the “Compulsory Quarantine of

Certain Persons Arriving at Hong Kong from Foreign Places Regulation”. Those arriving Hong Kong via HKIA must provide confirmation in English or Chinese of room reservation in a hotel in Hong Kong for not less than 14 days starting on the day of arrival, and are subject to compulsory quarantine at the hotel. - **All inbound travellers** who are subject to compulsory quarantine specified above should not have any symptoms and should pass temperature checks upon entry. Travellers with symptoms will be referred to the Department of Health (DH) for further handling.
- Arrivals holding or entitled to a **visa valid for less than 14 days** will be denied entry to Hong Kong.
- **Inbound travellers arriving at HKIA** will proceed to the Temporary Specimen Collection Centre (TSCC) in the restricted area of airport for COVID-19 testing. They will remain at the centre for test results, usually available on the same day, before immigration procedure and baggage collection.

Passengers whose test results will not be ready on the same day (usually passengers arriving in the afternoon or night) can clear immigration after their samples are collected. They will be taken by coach to the Holding Centre for Test Results in hotel to await test results. If necessary, inbound travellers arriving in the afternoon may also await test results at the collection centre.

- **Inbound travellers who have been to Shandong Province, Shanghai, Tianjin, Xinjiang or Inner Mongolia** in the past 14 days arriving via land boundary control points will be required to collect their deep throat saliva samples for conducting COVID-19 testing.
- From November 22, the Government tightens the testing and isolation arrangements for **air crew members and other persons exempted from quarantine requirement** upon arriving Hong Kong. For those who have visited very high risk places during 14 days prior to arrival in Hong Kong, they must possess a negative result of SARS-CoV-2 nucleic acid test done within 48 hours prior to the scheduled departure time of the flight to Hong Kong and take a post-arrival SARS-CoV-2 nucleic acid test at a designated place upon arrival at HKIA. The use of public transport is also prohibited; Since July 29, 2020, crew change arrangements for passenger vessels and goods vessels without cargo operations in Hong Kong have been suspended.

- From November 18, the Government tightens the testing and isolation arrangement for **consular and diplomatic officers who are exempted from quarantine arrangement** upon arriving Hong Kong, particularly those who have visited very high risk places (i.e. Bangladesh, Belgium, Ethiopia, France, India, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Russia, South Africa, Turkey, the United Kingdom and the United States of America).

### III. Restrictions on Entering Mainland China

- Since September 28, 2020, **foreign nationals holding valid Chinese residence permits for work, personal matters and reunion** are allowed to enter China with no need for applying for new visas. If the above three categories of residence permits held by foreign nationals expired after March 28, 2020, the holders may apply for relevant visas by presenting the expired residence permits and relevant materials to

the Chinese embassies or consulates on the condition that the purpose of the holders' visit to China remains unchanged. The above-mentioned personnel shall strictly abide by the Chinese regulations on epidemic prevention and control.

- On March 26, 2020, the Civil Aviation Administration of China announced that **every Chinese airline** is allowed to maintain only one route to any specific country, with only one flight per week. **Selected foreign airlines** are allowed to maintain one route to China with no more than one weekly flight. Since June 8, 2020, **all foreign airlines** are allowed to choose from a list of approved cities to operate one international passenger flight a week.
- **Guangdong and Shenzhen** requires all inbound travellers (including travellers from Hong Kong, Macao, and Taiwan, and transit passengers), regardless of onward destination, to take COVID-19 nucleic acid tests and undergo 14 days quarantine.
- Since April 28, 2020, travellers entering via **Shenzhen ports** are required to stay at a designated quarantine centre for 14 days for medical observation.
- Since July 17, 2020, everyone must present valid proof of a **negative COVID-19 nucleic acid test result issued by a testing institution recognised by the HKSAR Government**. Exceptions granted to people who have got prior approval for performing essential official and business duties, cross-boundary goods vehicle drivers, cross-boundary students, and those who come under the mutual recognition of compulsory quarantine by Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao. Negative test result will be considered valid only if it is within 72 hours of sample collection.

People without acceptable proof will be **refused entry to Guangdong**. If they have to re-enter Hong Kong after being barred from the Mainland, they will be subject to compulsory quarantine of 14 days.

- On July 21, 2020, the Civil Aviation Administration of China, General Administration of Customs and Ministry of Foreign Affairs announced that **all airport arrivals from overseas** will be required to undergo nucleic acid tests up to five days before departure at health centres designated or recognised by Chinese embassies overseas. Chinese embassies will evaluate the nucleic acid testing capacities of the countries in which they are located.
- From August 17, 2020, all **passengers travelling from Hong Kong to Beijing** are required to present a valid proof of a negative COVID-19 nucleic acid test result issued by a testing institution recognised by the HKSAR Government. The test must be within seven days before boarding the flight to Beijing. Please check with airlines for details.

## V. Travel Restrictions Imposed by Cruise Lines

[Aug 5] CLIA ocean-going cruise line members voluntarily suspend U.S. cruise operations until at least October 31, 2020.

## VI. WHO recommendations for international traffic in relation to COVID-19 outbreak

[Jul 30] Many countries have halted some or all international travel since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic but now have plans to re-open travel.

WHO recommends that priority should be given to essential travel for emergencies, humanitarian actions (including emergency medical flights and medical evacuation), travel of essential personnel (including emergency responders and providers of public health technical support, critical personnel in transport sector such as seafarers and diplomatic officers), and repatriation. Cargo transport should also be prioritised for essential medical, food and energy supplies. Sick travellers and persons at risk including elderly travellers and people with chronic diseases or underlying health conditions, should delay or avoid travelling internationally to and from areas with community transmission.

There is no “zero risk” when considering the potential importation or exportation of cases in the context of international travel. Therefore, thorough and continuous risk assessment and management will help identify, reduce and mitigate those risks, while balancing the socio-economic consequences of travel measures (or temporary restrictions) against potential adverse public health consequences.
